In addition to free-lance writing, blogging, video making, and moonlighting as a backup singer, she has worked with a host of organizations on research, advocacy and communications campaigns, and issues such as intellectual property protection, access to justice, and immigration.

Nyasha also founded and directs youth media campaigns for The Global Parish Project, a Belize-based organization dedicated to cultivating social and culturally relevant documentary storytelling. She produces youth-driven campaigns on topics such as urban renewal, cultural expression, and diversity that reach grassroots audiences, international stakeholders, and high-level policy makers.

Nyasha holds a degree in History from Yale University and a JD from NYU School of Law. Her documentary work has been showcased in the WOMEX IMZ Showcase (Seville), the Pan African Film Festival (Los Angeles), and the Pan Caribbean festival (Washington) and on national television stations in Belize.
